Job Description			
<p>The Water Safety Instructor(WSI) is responsible for performing swim lessons to patrons who sign up for the Learn To Swim program..</p> <p>He/she is a part-time employee, working from 2-12 hours per week. Work shifts are variable, with an average of two hours per day that class is scheduled. Work shifts may be as long as 3 hours.</p> <p>Work is performed at a self-controlled pace, but may vary depending on the demands of the job required.</p> <p>The WSI can be required at any given time to demonstrate his/her knowledge or ability to perform verbal or physical work activities, and can cover all aspects of any of the described essential functions.</p> <p>Qualifications The Water Safety Instructor must be at least 18 years of age, and in possession of the American Red Cross Water Safety Certification. He/she must have, or be able to successfully complete complete CPR and First aid Certification.</p> <p>Immediate Supervisor Superintendent of Fitness</p> <p>Essential Functions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teach courses and presentations in Parent and Child Aquatics, Preschool Aquatics, Learn-to-swim, Adult Swim, Private lessons, Water Safety Courses and Water Safety Presentations • Placing and removing lane lines. • Pulling out and putting away equipment/props for swim lessons. • Perform all job tasks within the rules & guidelines of the Park District safety program. • Effectively communicate student progress with parents. <p>Psychological Considerations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Water Safety Instructor must work closely with co-workers. • The Water Safety Instructor must work around the general population. The Water Safety Instructor must work under supervision & direction of supervisors. • The Water Safety Instructor has responsibility for safety of the general public in the pool and on the pool

deck.

- The Water Safety Instructor may have to work under stressful situations when first aid and/or CPR are required.
- The Water Safety Instructor has to be able to make decisions that ensure safety in the pool.

Physiological/Environmental Considerations:

- The Water Safety Instructor works in a climate of 86 degrees Fahrenheit and high humidity.
- The Water Safety Instructor has to be able to respond quickly and accurately.

Cognitive Considerations:

- The Water Safety Instructor must be able to follow directions from a supervisor.
- The Water Safety Instructor must be able to give directions to co-workers.
- The Water Safety Instructor must use good safety awareness and judgment.
